Dear Parents,

Greetings from Amanora!

Please note that we are fast approaching the **First Periodic Test** which is scheduled to be held from Friday, 04/08/2017. This circular is aimed at putting to rest some of the anxiety that surrounds the new assessment pattern. It may be noted that CBSE affiliated schools currently follow various systems of assessment and examination for classes VI to IX and issue different types of report cards to their students. Due to disparities in the system, the students of classes VI to IX face several problems whenever they migrate to another school. It has therefore, become imperative to have a uniform system of assessment, examination pattern and report cards for classes VI to IX for ease of the students and other stakeholders. This will not only ensure easy migration of students within the family of CBSE affiliated schools but also iron out any difficulties encountered while seeking admission in new schools.

The detailed components of the scheme are mentioned below for better understanding and implementation.

Scholastic Area: The assessment structure and examination for classes VI to VIII have been prepared in view of the provisions of RTE-Act 2009 and comprises of two terms i.e. **Term-1 and Term 2** as explained below:

Hope this brings some clarity on the new assessment scheme. Kindly note that Periodic tests are for 20 marks and the same will be conducted during normal working hours. The school will not make any provision to carry out retest for the students. We will not entertain any half day requests during the Periodic Tests. Please note that the timesheet and the portion for the first periodic test has already been shared vide school diary.
